Key Areas of Learning



Not a Stick! Reception Autumn Two 2023



To develop our Understanding the World skills we will be exploring Autumnal changes and asking the question, 'what happens at Autumn time?'. We will look closely at leaves, exploring how many colours we can find. We will learn about hibernation and how animals prepare for Winter. We will also think about the best materials to build dens, and consider which materials are the strongest and will protect us best from rain and wind.

To develop our Communication and Language skills the children will be learning how to share news with the rest of the class and taking part in whole class conversations, both listening, responding and asking questions.

To develop our Expressive Art and Design skills this term we will be making our own clay diva candles, making observational drawings of trees, bark and twigs. We will also be exploring charcoal and making our own charcoal drawings. We will be learning some new songs for Christmas too and performing a nativity play!

LITERACY

Comprehension – Demonstrate understanding of stories through verbal retelling, predict key events and use and apply new vocabulary learnt in different contexts. We will read Stanley's Stick and Stickman.

Word Reading – We will use our Moseley Phonics Scheme to develop children's phonic knowledge beginning learning new GPCs; develop children's book talk through weekly guided reading sessions; and answer questions about texts, thinking about what might happen next.

Writing — We will make opportunities for mark making inside and out; use our phonic knowledge to sound out cvc words and start writing captions and sentences.
