
French Year 3: In a French classroom

Sentence structure and phrases

In French, nouns are either masculine or feminine.

un is used for masculine singular nouns.


un crayon = masculine



a pencil

une is used for feminine singular nouns.


une trousse = feminine

When the noun is plural (more than one), we normally add an **s** like in English.
