EYFS and KS1 news

What an amazing first week back to school! Here are the highlights of the week:

This week, Reception started reading 'Blue Penguin'. This story is set in the Antarctica. During the week, Reception have been practising their fine motor skills by using tweezers to build sugar lump igloos!

Year I have started to learn all about Vincent Van Gogh. They discussed the techniques he used, as well as sharing opinions on what we liked and disliked. The children created their initial responses in pencil using his portraits, landscapes and still life as inspiration. Year 2 have also started looking at the artwork of Jan Griffier, while exploring plants in Science.

Class news — Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic start to the Spring term. We have done lots of new learning, including looking at the artwork of Jan Griffier in Art and different types of plants in Science. The children have been learning how to add pounds and pence in Maths and have really been enjoying our new story, Rabbit and Bear, during our English lessons. They created some brilliant story maps to help them retell the story and have also thought about the values shown in it, including friendship, hope and resilience.



KS2 news

As we come to the end of our first week, we can't help but reflect on all the amazing learning around school.

Our week started with a a special visitor in school, Mr Chilcott, who spoke to the children in Year 6 about the scientific theory for how the universe began (The Big Bang Theory), before giving his own interpretation of how God fits in.

We have also begun our new science units across the school. Year 5 have been testing different materials based on their properties. They had fun using magnets on a variety of things in class. Year 4 have been learning about Myths and Legends. They have been looking at the Nose Myth of Thor and the Might Hammer, which links to their class-reading book this half term -Arthur and the Golden Rope. Year 3 have been learning about Yayoi Kusama and the inspiration behind her artwork. They have created research pages to highlight key events from her life before sharing their first thoughts about her work.

Our new Explorify club started on Thursday with an amazing turnout across the school. Thank you to all our children, families and staff for the continued support.









Class news – Year 6

Year 6 began our new RE topic (Science and Creation: Conflicting or Complementary?) with a visit from Mr Chilcott, a Christian physicist. Mr Chilcott spoke began by speaking to us all about the scientific theory for how the universe began (The Big Bang Theory), before giving his own interpretation of how God fits in. We had the opportunity to ask lots of questions and enjoyed thinking deeply about all of the things science is yet to be able to explain - we spent a long time considering what 'nothing' actually is! Mr Chilcott also shared his favourite photo ever taken; an image taken by The Hubble Telescope of a patch of sky the size of a thumb nail. Within this tiny patch of sky, The Hubble Telescope captured the image of more than a quarter of a million galaxies!
