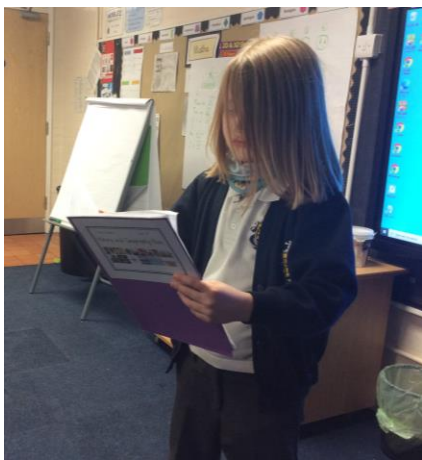

EYFS and KS1 news

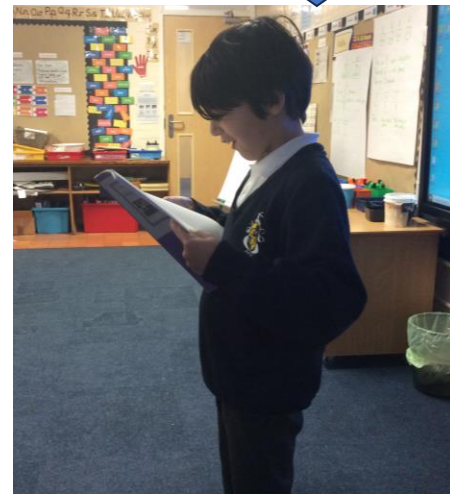

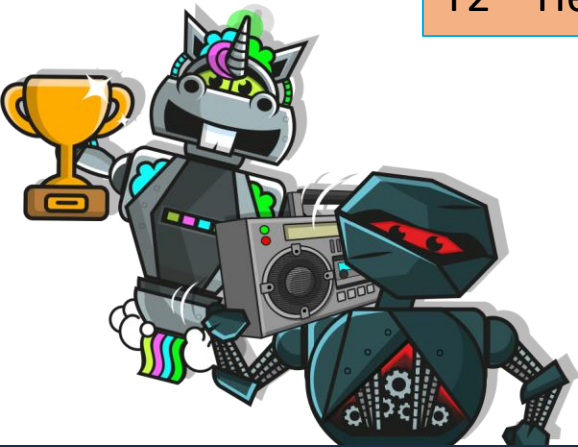

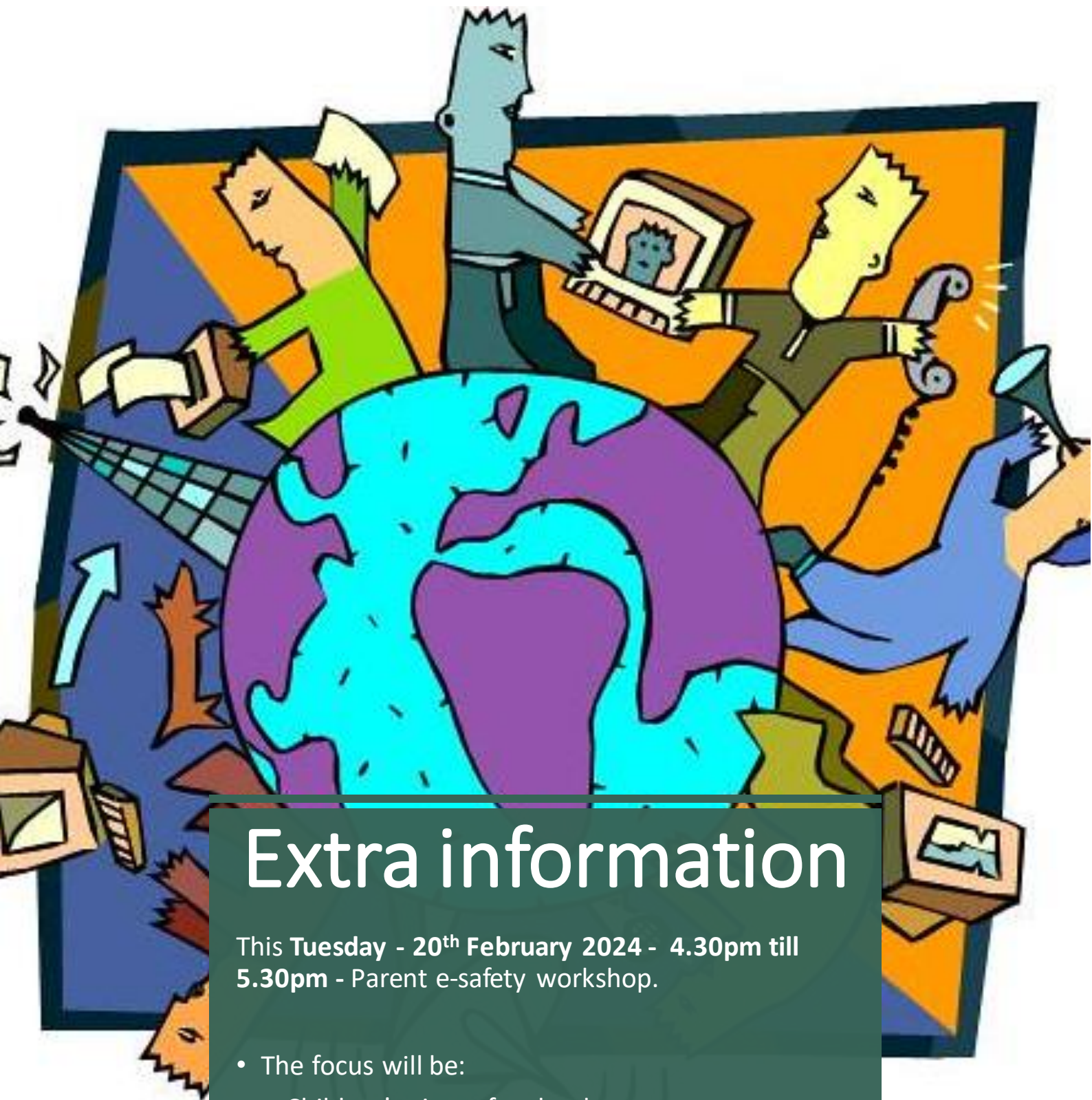
