EYFS and KS1 news

This week YR made soup. We carefully chopped the vegetables and then boiled them to make soup. We whizzed the soup and then ate the whole pan full! It was delicious!

We have also been learning about Pentecost. We listened carefully when Rev. Magdalen told us the story in Collective Worship, and then we drew some beautiful pastel pictures of the story and wrote some super sentences. We also made flame headbands and created a fun display in the corridor.



Year 1 have been investigating plants that are evergreen. Some of the children found plants at home, labelled them and made posters to show which ones they had found. We enjoyed finding the plants and talking about the differences we could see on the leaves



This week, we will focus on Year 2

Year 2 had a super church service on Thursday, all about Pentecost and why it is such an important celebration for Christians. Look at all the photos – we were very proud of all the children who read really clearly and sang beautifully.

Year 2's Pentecost service



In Year 2's RE lesson, we have been learning about the importance of Pentecost. We have learnt that the Holy Spirit gifted the disciples the ability to talk in many different languages so they can spread god's word. It is an important time for Christians as this represents the beginning of the Christian church. We rehearsed our service and performed it to the rest of the school and our parents.



KS2 news

Year 3 have been reflecting upon and summarising Ancient Egyptian beliefs. The children have used a range of sources gathered across the unit of work, alongside books borrowed from Dudley Library Service. They have developed answers to their enquiry question - 'What did the Ancient Egyptians believe?'



This week in year 4, we have been learning all about the illnesses and diseases that children suffered from in the Tudor and Victorian eras. We learned about the gruesome side effects and the equally gruesome treatments!



Year 5 have completed their final animations in computing; the children have done an amazing job created stop motion animation using a range of tools and techniques. The children have also create amazing information posters to showcase their understand of Ancient Greece.



Year 6 have been debating the pros and cons of plastic in English, in preparation for writing a balanced argument. They also learnt about the roles of women in WW2 and presented their findings to the class.


We would also like to celebrate the achievements of Lakhan, from Year 4. Lakhan is a member of 'United Through Sports'

Just play – always try your best, never give up and keep practicing – as often as you can.


