

To start our week of learning about subtraction, we built cube towers and took different amounts away. We counted what was left to find the answers to our number sentences!

Comparing animal groups

World Book Day Spoons


We loved seeing the creativity of the spoon characters! The children shared with the class their favourite books and characters and how they made their spoons.








Our 2025 'World Book Day' ...









Year 3 News





'I loved seeing everyone's spoons and finding out why they had chosen each book or character to make.'


Year 4 News








Year 6News











In Computing, Year 6 have been learning about AI. The children worked in pairs to come up with AI solutions to a range of problems.


