Here is another issue of our school newsletter – to keep you up to date with all things exciting at Moseley CE.

This week we have joined in national schools awareness of rail safety with Network Rail – they led live assemblies for both KS1 and KS2, detailing how important it is to be safe when you are at a railway station, on the platform or even near a railway line, for example at a level crossing.

There were interactive videos that children had to watch and then share ideas about how to best keep the characters safe.

Each year group were then awarded a certificate from Network Rail for their participation and excellent listening skills.

All the children showed excellent Moseley Values, listened very carefully and spoke thoughtfully about how important it is to keep safe near trains.






Rosie Lindsay in Year 4 achieved her 200m distance award at swimming last week.

FYI, according to their fab coach, aka Mr Boulton –


Ava scored a superb hat trick and is our leading goal scorer to date! Charlie has made some fantastic saves this season.

There are daily prize draws too where we could win equipment for school. The Eco Council have been around the classes delivering presentations to let the children know about it.





Art:





This week, we are celebrating Imogen for her determination and positive attitude.








Year 4 News














In Science, this week, we have been learning about circuits and how they work. We had to make a simple circuits using the components we had, such as buzzers and light bulbs.

The Star in Year 4, this week, goes to Sophia! For some great tricky decimals work in maths.



This week, in DT, Year 6 built different types of moving structures in Lego. Hopefully, this will help them re-create similar structures in their playgrounds!








In Computing, Year 6 have been learning about AI. They were given a series of prompts that could be entered into AI. Each prompt got progressively


