#### from 15 September 2025 for up to 3 months

Transport for West Midlands would like all students and staff to be aware of upcoming roadworks at St Mary's Row in Moseley. We encourage you to plan journeys carefully to and from your site.

Highway works at Moseley Village Rail Station are set to take place for **up to three months** in several phases, with the first beginning on **Monday 15 September** at the junction of St. Mary's Row and Oxford Road.

For up to 3 months, traffic signals allowing a single lane of traffic will be introduced to a small section of St Mary's Row, Moseley.

**Oxford Road** will be **closed** at the junction of St Mary's Row with a reduction in car parking spaces in this area.

There will be a local signed diversion to the Marks & Spencer's car park via School Road.

Oxford Road will remain open to pedestrians and cyclists.

We don't want the huge pile of clothes that stacked up at the end of the summer term to return. If uniform is labelled, it stands a much better




#### Also -

#### The Colour Monster

Our first book in Reception is 'The Colour Monster'. We have been working on our 'Get Up, Stand Up Vocabulary!' and learnt discombobulated, sobbing, enraged, timid and tranguillity. #### RE

During RE this week we talked about the amazing world that we live in. We looked at a globe and discussed where animals live and then drew our favourite animals.



#### **Observational Drawing**

Indoors, we explored some sunflowers very carefully and then used pastels to draw the sunflowers, taking care to notice details of colour, shape and texture.

Outdoors, we used chalks to explore large

movements and mark making.



## Year 1 News

#### **Drawing to Music**

In Art, we have been learning about making marks using different types of line. We have practised drawing wiggly lines, zigzag lines, vertical lines, diagonal lines – the list goes on! We learnt that the artist Paul Klee described "a line as a dot that went for a walk" – Year 1 had a fantastic discussion about this idea! Afterwards, we listened to different pieces of classical music and drew lines inspired by what we could hear.



During our writing lessons, we have been focussing upon the story "Ruby's Worry". This week, we thought about vocabulary we could use to describe a joyful and exciting place. We used the blocks to create an exciting setting that Ruby might enjoy exploring.











#### **Funky Fingers**

Year 1 have been enjoying developing their fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination with funky fingers activities. This week, they've taken part in dough gym as well as threading activities.





#### Get Up, Stand Up Vocabulary

We've learnt four new words and actions this week in relation to our story, Ruby's Worry. They are:

Year 2 News

This week, in Writing, we have been exploring stories set in familiar places. The children are enjoying sharing their own experiences of special days. Using a familiar setting is a fantastic way for them to tap into their imagination and develop their writing skills. Encourage your child to tell you their stories at home, as storytelling can greatly enhance their confidence and creativity.





In Maths, we've been focusing on place value, and the children have been using Rekenreks to help deepen their understanding. This hands-on approach is proving to be very effective, and I encourage you to practise using objects at home, such as buttons or coins, to support their learning. Understanding place value is fundamental for their confidence in maths as we progress through the year.

We have also been exploring what makes a church. We're excited to build on our understanding and appreciation of churches.




## Year 3 – Week 1

In Science, we are leaning about the human boy and skeletons. We learned about the main 3 functions of the skeleton and also made our own ones using split pins!





In Maths, we have been learning our numbers to 1000!



I am pleased to inform you that, due to the huge success of our football courses over the last **25 years**, we are following up the football coaching programme for the season starting in September 2025. The course will run for approximately 12 weeks and the programme is for boys and girls aged between 4 and 12.

#### **About our Course**

- Each child will be provided with a football for individual practice and their progress will be recorded each week.
